

WHAT IS DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY

Slow to meet or not reaching milestones in one or more of the are of development in a way expected f the child's age



- Law
- States & public agencies provide early intervention, special education & related services to children with disabilities

Hawaii Administrative Rules: Chapter 60

Early Intervention Part C (DOH)



School Age Part B (DOE)

- ✓ Services to eligible infants and toddlers from birth to age 3 & their families.
- ✓ Eligibility: Developmental delays and/or diagnosed medical condition w/ high probability of developmental delay §632(5)(A)).
- Multidisciplinary team, includes family to develop IFSP
- ✓ Focus: maximize family's ability to understand & care for their child's developmental needs

- Services to eligible children, ages 3 22
 - Developmental Delay (3-5)
 - Developmental Delay (6-8)
- ✓ Eligibility: Criteria used to determine if the child has a disability that is adversely impacting educational progress or ability to participate in age appropriate activities §8-60-31
- Qualified professionals, including parent(s) develops the IEP
- ✓ Focus: provision of a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)

Experiencing developmental delays as defined by the State

IDEA allows each state to use a definition of developmental delay









