The big picture: AI & inclusion



- Consolidation of power
- History of previous waves of innovation
- Technological feasibility was never the barrier to inclusion → political and sociocultural

- AI used on a case-by-case basis by teachers for individualization of instruction → more targeted instruction with less preparation time
